When Dingle businessman Jerry O'Sullivan spotted a gap in the market for a quality Irish-made draught premium lager, he vowed to name it after one of the area's most famous sons, the decorated Antarctic explorer Tom Crean. Tom's connection to the drinks industry was well-known; in the 1920s, he had opened the South Pole Inn in the village of Anascaul on the Dingle peninsula and, more recently, had been the subject of an award-winning Guinness advertisement.

Just outside Dingle, a former creamery with an excellent spring well attached proved to be the ideal location to set up the newly formed Dingle Brewing Company. The next issue was finding the best energy to power the premises and as Jerry had a very good working relationship with Flogas, he asked local Flogas sales representative Mike Murphy to come up with an energy solution for the new microbrewery.
